Background:

Purpose of the role:

We are seeking to recruit a Programme Lead for Health and Life Sciences to join our Executive Team to take the lead in working with partners to drive forward the delivery and communication of a strategic programme of action aligned with the North East Strategic Economic Plan and the Health and Life Sciences strategy. You will co-ordinate the Steering Group and a wider network of partners, support the ongoing development of our strategy and ensure delivery of a strategic pipeline of priority projects. You will lead a programme of active communications about the North East health and life sciences community and the programme. You will be able to demonstrate deep knowledge of the sector and a range of leadership and development skills.

The post is partly resourced with money secured from the Office of Life Sciences through the Academic Health Science Network which aims to strengthen business engagement with the public health system and partly from the Centre for Process Innovation which is a key partner to the LEP in the development of the overall Health and Life Sciences programme.
