Who we are.

Zone West is an early intervention project for children and young people, a collaboration between health, education and the community resources of West Newcastle. We work to place identified children at the centre of multi-source preventative support, working for long-term transformations. Zone West is a project managed by North East Wellbeing (reg charity no: 1154255)

Our Inspiration

We are inspired by the Harlem Children's Zone, the West London Zone and the people, workers and resources of West Newcastle.

North East Wellbeing's purpose is to create NEW landscapes of life chances for vulnerable children through colourful and creative education.

Our Vision

Zone West's vision is of vulnerable children flourishing at the centre of integrated care to become positive influencers and drive change.

Our Strategy

Primary Schools in the West End of Newcastle serve a multi-cultural population and face multiple problems These include increasing levels of poverty, poor nutrition, and mental and emotional problems. All of these impact on health and learning outcomes and there is increasingly robust long-term evidence that indicates that being behind in primary school has an adverse impact on employment, income and health in adult life. In addition, there are increasing numbers of children who have educational special needs and/or mental health problems who do not meet the assessment criteria for service provision. This group require early intervention and support in order to build on existing strengths and flourish.

Zone West works with schools, local GP practices and voluntary sector organisations in order to develop a systematic approach to identifying and supporting these children and their parents. Once they have been identified, link workers engage with them and their families in order to provide a personalised package of local support. Zone West works with local activity and support providers in order to develop a menu of activities that can be accessed to provide personalised support plans. We are data-led and evidence-based, with Link Workers spending time gathering data to test and evaluate this approach with the intention of producing a model that can be scaled and spread.

In short, our strategy is to use stakeholders' knowledge of the West End of Newcastle, the people, the community and its assets to create packages of care that change the lives of children. We believe we can best achieve this change by placing the child at the centre of the picture, orientating services around them by linking them to an independent worker who will be responsible for child outcomes.

Purpose of the role

We are looking for a highly motivated person collaborate with the Chief Executive of North East Wellbeing (NEW) to develop and establish Zone West in the family of NEW projects (see www.northeastwellbeing.co.uk). This person will have responsibility do the development and delivery of Zone West and will join NEW's team of Project Managers, the 'Boost Team'.

This is a 0.6 FTE post: 22.5 hours per week. The office is located in Benwell, Newcastle upon Tyne, and Zone West currently operates in the schools GP surgeries and communities of the West End of Newcastle, with the intention to expand into East Newcastle and Teesside.

Zone West's purpose is to join and link community resources to release talent and potential in children. We do this by developing bespoke support packages for children for their long-term development.

Purpose of Role

The Zone West Project Manager will collaborate with the Chief Executive and other members of the Boost Team to set the organization's strategic goals and to translate these into specific operational objectives. This will mean:

- Working in close partnership with other members of the Boost Team, inviting and offering help.
- Delivering Zone West operational objectives by managing and quality assuring all key activities of Zone

Key Tasks and Responsibilities

The Zone West Project Manager will work with schools and practitioners to maintain and develop Zone West Practice. This means:

- Maintaining overview and quality control of all Zone West Activities, developing operational plans with the Boost Team and meeting concerns with a collaborative approach.
- Managing Zone West's Link Worker Team, listening with ideas and solutions through formal and informal supervision and review.
- Managing the induction process and continuing professional development to maintain professional standards of Link Worker delivery in line with the Theory of Change
- Managing the relationships with Zone West's partners in Schools and GP surgeries, responding to feedback, complaints and compliments to enhance best practice.
- Manage the Link Worker's caseload and the process of School & GP referral and selection.
- Ensure Link Worker documentation and activity data is accurate and data-entry on management systems is efficient.
- Oversee the completion of the Child's Personal Development Plan, and progress made against it
- Collaborate with all aspects of Zone West's research, in particular the completion of data-packs at important reporting points.

Responsibilities of all North East Wellbeing Staff

- Comply with all relevant North East Wellbeing Safeguarding policies
- Maintain an awareness of health and safety and comply with ZONE WEST's Health and Safety Procedures

The Project Manager will be working closely with Link Workers who provide young people in the West of Newcastle with the opportunities and relationships to enable them to flourish in life. The Project Manager is a key appointment for a growing operation, and will help the Link Workers to be effective in a multidisciplinary environment that includes the Primary Care Network of GP practices, education and community groups.

The Project Manager will help the Link Workers to deliver outcomes for children on their caseload, by providing work planning and reflection, together with support for meeting targets. Link Worker are highly committed with a strong independent work ethic: the Project Manager will be comfortable with a lively group of people working to a strongly articulated vision of change.

The Project Manager will build trusting relationships with the Link Worker team and all associated professionals, and be comfortable moving between professional groups to create a shared personalised plan for children. The Link Workers evidence their work through demonstrating outcomes for children: the Project Manager will work with them to ensure that all data gathering targets are met, and the casemanagement system is up to date.
