Job Purpose

To work with Nurseries and Pre-school settings to provide a range of specialist intervention programmes at individual child or group level to facilitate effective learning and to assist settings to build capacity through coaching and modelling

The key roles of this post will include:

- To work with identified children who have a need for intervention to help overcome barriers to learning resulting from a Special Educational Need and/or disability.
- 2. To work in collaboration with Specialist Teachers and Portage workers from the Pre-school Inclusion Team and nursery or setting staff in the implementation and review of Action Plans for identified children, where appropriate.
- 3. To implement and deliver specialist intervention programmes to remove barriers to learning and maximise children's achievement.
- 4. To inform, develop and enhance the practice of nursery and setting support staff, in relation to SEN in Early Years through specialist coaching and modelling and promoting improvement strategies to secure effective learning.
- 5. To work with the Nursery teacher and/or other staff in planning, evaluating, and adjusting learning activities as appropriate
- 6. To establish productive working relationships with children, challenge and motivate them, promote, and reinforce self-esteem and set high expectations.
- 7. To support children to achieve targets. This could be one to one or as a group.
- 8. To provide feedback to children in relation to their progress, achievement, behaviour etc where appropriate.
- 9. To maintain effective internal and external relationships to assist in the coordination of the requirements of children with SEND and their families.

- 10. To maintain all necessary records as required by nursery schools and settings and the Pre-School Inclusion Team to enable monitoring of quality, delivery, and outcomes.
- 11. To determine the need for, prepare and use equipment, plans and resources to support children
- 12. To design and develop specialist resources, where appropriate, which meet children's individual needs.
- 13. To assist in enabling children, and their peers, to have a greater understanding of their SEN to promote inclusion.
- 14. To provide specialist preparation for, and consolidation of, learning activities.
- 15. To engage with the review process for individual children to report on progress and inform future targets.
- 16. To undertake training relevant to the role.
- 17. To adhere to the policies and overall ethos of each setting worked in.
- 18. To conduct, as required, any other tasks deemed appropriate to the post.
